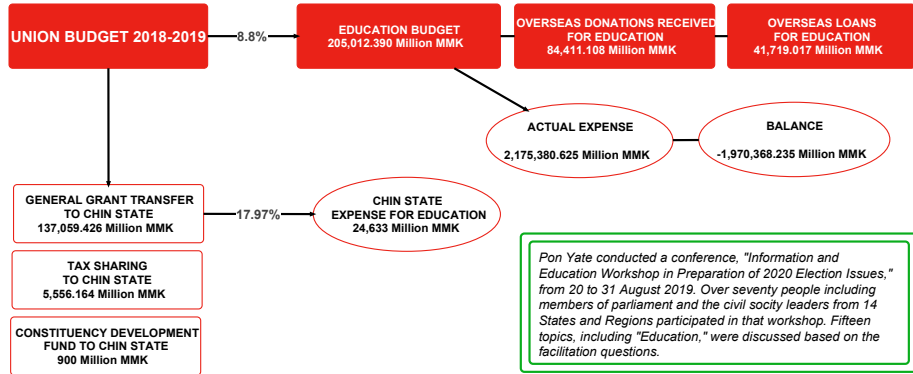

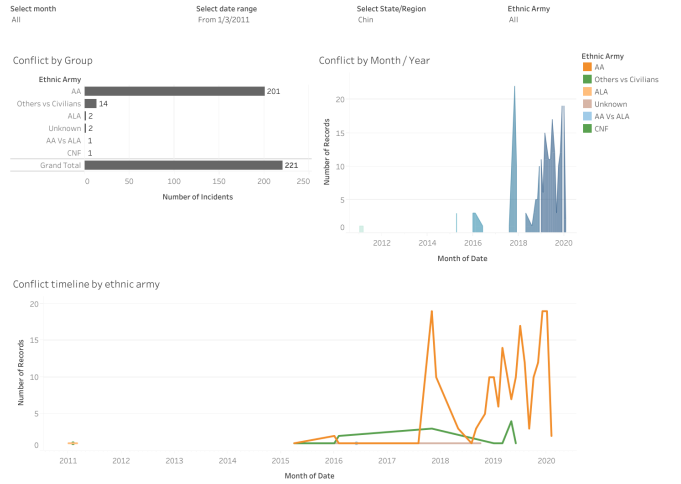


Findings and Recommendations from the Workshop

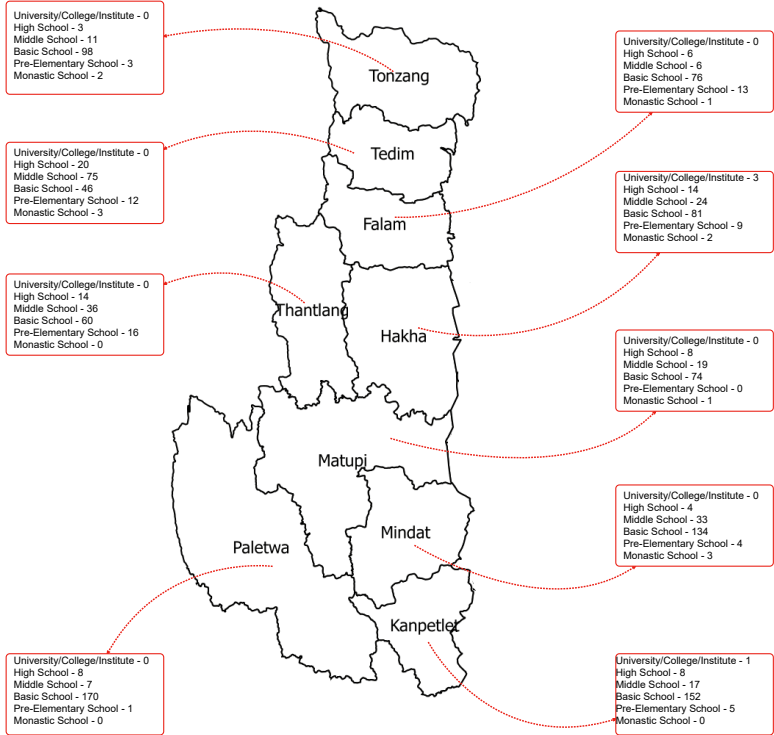
- Need a quality, nondiscriminatory education system that should be accessible and be conscious of the local context.
- Create a decentralized education policy.
- A monitored mother-tongue education-based curriculum that supports informal education for older students or illiterate students.
- Need transparency on the education budget at the State and Regional levels.
- Increase the budget and support a smaller teacher-student ratio.
- The Government should support private schools and teach subjects on human rights, government laws, ethics, sex education, and drug awareness.
- Create viable options for university students who face difficulty with transportation.

GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS IN CHIN STATE



Armed clashes between the AA and the military in Paletwa township in November 2018, 118 schools were closed because of no teacher. Government officials say 94 schools have only one teacher.

About 300 additional teachers are needed to fully staff schools in Chin State's Paletwa township and for the whole state, about 600 teachers needed to be assigned, according to state Minister of Municipal Affairs, Electricity and Industry, U Soe Htet.
